Reunion started on August 3, when family members gathered in the evening at the Jenny Wiley Pool for movies and a float party. The evening allowed cousins to catch up around the pool.

Friday morning a stalwart group did the Hatfield and McCoy Feud Tour, Part II, hosted by Sheryle Sullivan, Nina Rose Hatfield, and Joy Kay Hatfield. The group explored the geographic and cultural influences

on decisions made by William Anderson "Devil Anse" Hatfield during the Fued. The group went to the Anderson Hatfield Memorial Cemetery at McCarr, Kentucky, the final resting place of two important persons to the Feud. Ephraim Hatfield, born about 1765, is the progenitor of the Hatfields in the Tug River Valley, including the Hatfield participants in the Feud. Anderson Hatfield presided over the dispute between Randall McCoy and Floyd Hatfield

over the ownership of a hog and he was a witness to other Feud events, including the 1882 Election Day fight. The tour then went to Sarah Ann, West Virginia, where participants climbed the hill to where William Anderson "Devil Anse" Hatfield, the Hatfield feudists leader, is buried. In addition, Devil Anse's wife, Levicy Chafin, and eight of his children, including Johnson "Johnse," are buried there. The group reviewed some of the descriptions of Devil Anse and Levicy written by TC Crawford, who did the only known interview of Devil Anse and Levicy at their home.

The tour made its final stop at the Ellison Hatfield Cemetery in Matewan, West Virginia. Ellison, trying to stop a fight, was mortally wounded in 1882 by the three sons of Randall McCoy, leading to conflict between the two families.


Gina and Jim

Alex Noonan [Phyllis Blackburn], is playing both lacrosse and T-ball in his hometown of Worthington, Ohio.




